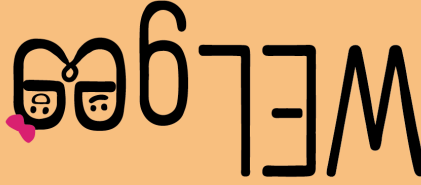

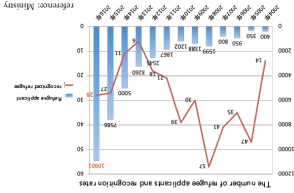

Who are the people called "refugees" ?

A refugee is someone who has been forced to flee his or her country because of persecution, war, or violence.

A refugee has well-founded fear of persecution for reasons of race, religion, nationality, political opinion or membership in a particular social group. Most likely, they cannot return home or are afraid to do so. War and ethnic, tribal and religious violence are leading causes of refugees fleeing their countries. By the end of 2016, 65.6 million individuals were forcibly displaced worldwide as a result of persecution, conflict, violence, or human rights violations.

together amongst Japanese and International members who are also refugees, beyond the differences of nationality, race and religion, and change what has been referred to as "issue" to the "uniqueness" of society.

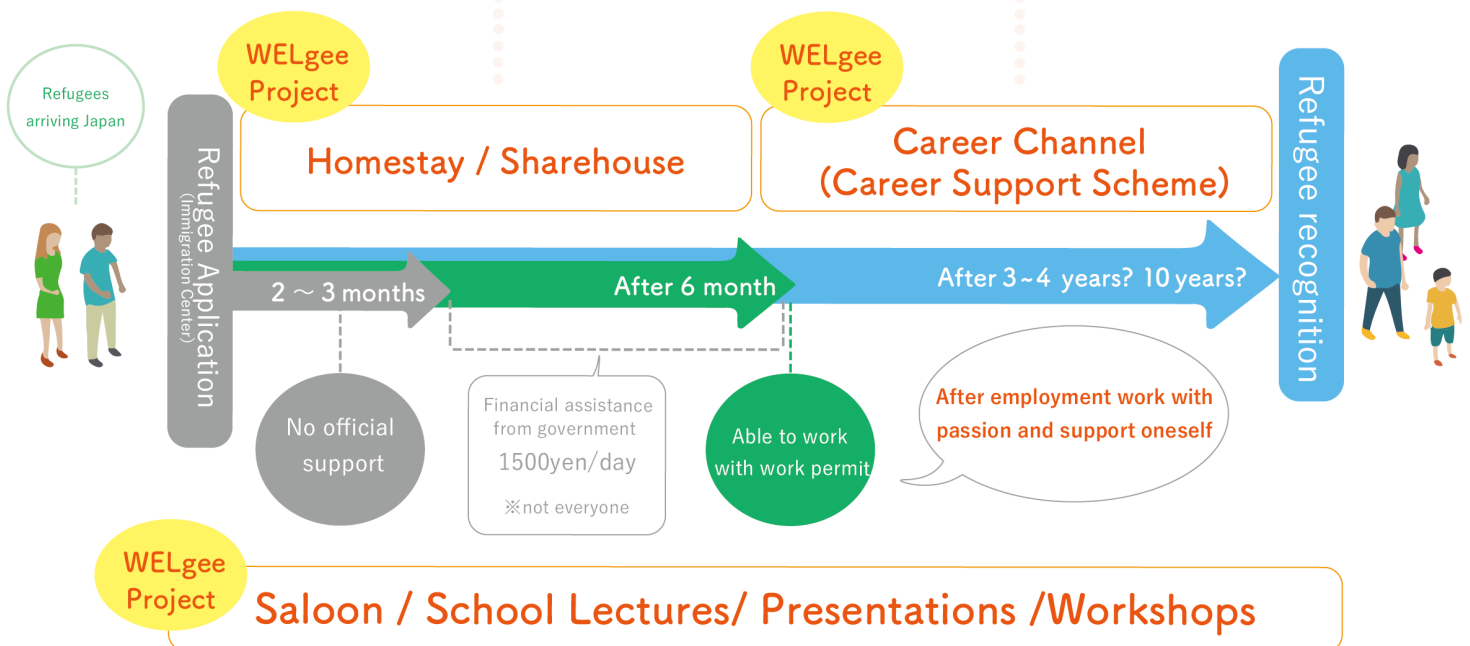
Project

We create relationship like "second family" through homestay of refugees and Japanese households. At the sharehouse program, we prepare young refugee applicants attending the Career Channel towards self-support while living and communicating with Japanese youth.

Work WITH

We discover refugees' individual talents, skills and characters and coordinate them with companies hiring unique personnels, in order to create opportunities for their emancipation in Japanese society. It is a scheme that encourages enthusiastic youth regardless of their nationalities.



Talk WITH

We host monthly interactive sessions to deliver the real voices of refugees to learn and discuss about refugee crisis, as well as conduct lectures at schools and present in companies and local organizations, to create foundation to accepting refugees.
